PIGGEN/PIGGIN of Norwich

Introduction

This survey of the descendants of Thomas PIGGIN (d. 1744/45) is a work in progress, as there are many loose ends and several possible sources of information yet to be consulted. The Piggin/Piggen line is relatively new to me, uncovered when I recently extended the pedigree of my Winter ancestors by another couple of generations.

Like the Winters, the Piggins belonged to a community of weaving families in the St. James/St. Paul area of Norwich in the 17th and 18th C who lived and worked together and tended to marry within the community, so that there is often more than one link between particular families. A good example of this is the marriage of James Winter and Rebecca Piggin, both relatives of mine, in 1815. They were first cousins through their Edwards mothers, and second cousins once removed through the Piggin family. I have not included all the Winter descendants in this pedigree as this would duplicate part of a separate Winter tree.

I began this study on my own using original sources and published indexes, but have since become aware of previous research conducted by other family members, summarised at www.piggin.org and on a number of other web pages. Having cross-checked with these pedigrees, and with several other connected family historians, I can say that what follows is in broad agreement although we do have some different conclusions relating to particular individuals. The recent publication of transcripts of many of the relevant Norfolk parish registers by FreeREG and the Norfolk Family History Society, and the availability of images of original registers through the LDS familysearch site has greatly helped to clear up some previously doubtful relationships.

There is a certain amount of speculation in this tree, which I have indicated by using phrases such as "possibly" or "probably" etc. No doubt there are also some mistakes and much more information yet to be found. Any contributions, comments, additions or corrections are very welcome!
